I knew my perspectives on mothers, children, and co-parents in our community, but I wanted to know more about their perspectives... so I asked. The following is what they wrote to us. My thanks to them for responding, my thanks to you for reading it. Next month we'll hear from the "childless". Regardless of perspectives, may we all exist together peacefully.

(This letter is a combined effort of the mothers group that meets once a month)

Dear Sisters,

We wanted to express our gratitude to womyn in our community for the time and energy that you give our children when we are together. You continue to be a positive role model for children everywhere, for you help to reinforce a very important value that we try to instill - "acceptance". Paental responsibility is a committment that we take quite seriously and we would ask for your understanding when it comes to social events. It is not as easy as putting on a coat and walking out the door when we go to social is an involved process of locating a babysitter, activities. It transportation, and long goodbyes to our children. We seeleasbian/gay families as people who live and love together, it does not necessarily always involve children. We see lesbian/gay families as a progression, not a regression. We have made an importan decision to raise children in a gay/lesbian culture that should reflect total acceptance. Yet we often feel we are not accepted in our own community. As mothers/co-parents we see a separatist attitude when it comes to male children. Planned activities that could include children have a preface of "adults only". Statements such as "how happy you are to be childless" can be hurtful to children who are near and also very difficult for children to process. Children look to adults for guidance, they look to you for acceptance.

Children accept everything - everyone. Descrimination is a learned, yet changeable, behavior. Our children do not look at you as a different person. they look at you as a friend, someone to play softball with, or someone to share a hot dog with, or someone that once gave them a horsey-back

ride. You are their friends!

And we hope that all of the wonderful, shared experiences with or without our children will continue. Respectfully,

Dear Editorettes and Womynspace Community:

In the previous Womynspace newsletter, Lynne S. raised the question about whether to go on publishing the Womynspace Newsletter or "join forces" with us at the Erie Gay Community Newsletter. Lynne told me that people hadn't been calling up to give the newsletter (heretofore WSN) any news, and as a result the WSN was becoming something of an echo of EGCN.

As a co-editor of the <u>EGCN</u>, I must say that I would be very saddened to see the <u>WSN</u> stop publication. Your newsletter is a very important and necessary part of the Womynspace community. Some thoughts:

- 1. By sharing information about what's going on in each other's lives, <u>WSN</u> creates an atmosphere at the coffeehouse that encourages a sense of community and discourages the development of cliques. Think about how this works: if info just gets shared only among those who see each other a lot, these people will naturally participate more, others will feel left out, etc. Womynspace really is remarkable in its absence of cliques, and I have to think the <u>WSN</u> has a lot to do with that.
- 2. The <a href="Erie Gay Community Newsletter">Erie Gay Community Newsletter</a> would be happy to publish just about everything that now goes into the <a href="WSN">WSN</a>. But <a href="EGCN">EGCN</a> goes out to the community at large and the majority of Womynspace folks seem to feel uncomfortable about going public with Womynspace activities. If the <a href="WSN">WSN</a> newsletter ceases, where will you find out about the picnics, softball games, parties and such? Where are you going to find out about what's what's going on with everybody? Do you really want to publicize these things through us?
- 3. At EGCN, our resources and space are limited. What that means is that, even if we have the desire to print all kinds of stuff, we simply don't have the money (hint, hint) to be large enough to accommodate everything we get. So we prioritize articles and info, using criteria like timeliness, interest to the LesBiGay community at large, balance (female-male, serious-light, upbeat-bummer, etc.), tie-ins with current organizing efforts, and so on. We scrunch as much in there as we can, but there's always a lot that gets left out, too.

WSN, on the other hand, is wide-open to just about anything. You don't really want to lose such a resource, do you?

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- 4. WSN really sets a tone for Womynspace. The friendly, affirming, supportive, over-the-fence chatty style it is written in provides a model for relationships within the coffeehouse community and gives newcomers a comfortable introduction to that community. Michael Mahler, who is co-editor of EGCN, was so impressed with WSN and its contribution to building community that he started up a newsletter for the Men's Coffeehouse, modeling it after WSN.
- 5. The Womynspace Newsletter and the Erie Gay Community
  Newsletter serve two different purposes. One is not
  more important than the other; rather, they complement
  each other.


Some thoughts on how to address the concerns of the Editorettes: EDITORETTE ? ? !!

- 1. First, you start with getting some kind of indication of how many people use, read and need the WSN. I'm pretty confident that people will respond positively, but let's just start out by asking...say, at the next coffeehouse. I hope the Editorettes will not be discouraged if nobody else actually wrote down their opinions and submitted them to WSN; most people hate to write, and the fact that they didn't write anything doesn't necessarily mean they don't care.
- Agree on some guidelines about what belongs in the newsletter, what belongs in the announcements, and what deserves mention in both.
- I have heard complaints that people take up coffeehouse time with announcements, which could have been just as effectively--or more effectively--communicated through the newsletter, thus freeing up time for socializing and such.

Another problem with reliance on announcements is, unless you are there when they're being made, you don't get the information. Information in the <u>WSN</u>, however, can be taken in just as well by women who arrive late or who weren't able to get to the coffeehouse.

You don't need to be rigid about the suggested guidelines, but it might help route things to where they belong.

3. It's possible that Womynspace people may not know what kind of participation or communication the Editorettes



would like from them. This could be discussed with the group at the next available opportunity.

4. I am sure it would help the morale of the Editorettes if Womynspace people consciously and verbally recognized the contributions that they make to this community. That's not a call for phony, mechanical thank-you's... it's just that a healthy community needs its members to be appreciative of each other and to express that appreciation to one another.
