Be it Remembered, That at a COURT OF COMMON PLEAS, held at Ebensburg, in and for the County of Cambria, in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in the United States of America, on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand ~~eight~~ <sup>nine</sup> hundred and ~~ninety~~ two, Isaac Abraham

a native of Turkey exhibited a petition to be admitted to become a citizen of the United States. And it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court, that he had resided

within the limits and under the Jurisdiction of the United States for five years immediately preceding his application, and that during that time he had behaved as a man of good moral character, attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same, and that he had in all things fully complied with the laws of the United States in such case made and provided; and having declared on his solemn Oath before the said Court that he would support the Constitution of the United States, and that he did absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure forever all allegiance and fidelity to every foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty whatever, and particularly to the Sultan of Turkey of whom he was before a subject. Whereupon the Court admitted the said Isaac Abraham

to become a Citizen of the United States, and ordered all the proceedings aforesaid to be recorded by the Prothonotary of said County which was done accordingly.

In Testimony Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed the seal of the said Court at Ebensburg, this fifteenth day of January Anno Domini ~~1902~~ <sup>1902</sup>, and of the Sovereignty and Independence of the United States of America the one hundred and twenty sixth

The Petition of Dobe Abraham  
a native of Syria (Lebanon) respectfully sheweth:  
That your Petitioner arrived in the United States of America, to wit: On the  
11<sup>th</sup> day of April A. D. 1891 and that  
in pursuance of an Act in Congress, entitled "An Act Establishing a Uniform  
Rule of Naturalization, and to Repeal the Acts heretofore passed on that Sub-  
ject," made a declaration of his intention to become a citizen of the United  
States, and a report and registry of his nativity, age, allegiance, emigration,  
arrival, and intended place of settlement in the United States, conformably to  
the said Act, before the Prothy for the  
County of Cambria on the 15<sup>th</sup>  
day of Jan A. D. 1902,

and that he has resided within the limits,  
and under the jurisdiction of the United States, for five years last past, and  
for one year last past within the State of Pennsylvania; that he has never  
borne any hereditary title, or been of any of the orders of nobility, in the king-  
dom whence he came, or elsewhere. He therefore prays that he may be ad-  
mitted to become a citizen of the United States. And he will ever pray, etc.

to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to  
the good order and happiness of the same.
