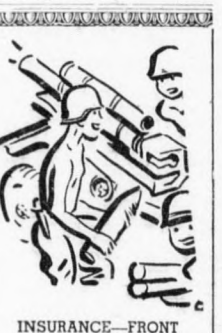

FOSTER-FATHER OF NOBODY'S BAIRNS

July 4th, 1845 Dr. Thomas John Barnard 1945

Nooby's bairns, disowned, dejected, driven by dread. Hungry, homeless and hopeless, no place for their head. Poor we straying lambs, sadly bereft o' a fold, Ever wandering around in the damp and the cold. Dammed into life through no fault o' their own, For the sins o' your parents, compelled to atone, Shunned or shod by a heedless heartless throne. A wee waif's wail in the world's mad song. Christ in loving kindness, raised up a young man, O' poise, purpose and power, and gave him a plan, Endowed him with grace, wit wisdom and will, And crowned him with courage, compassion and skill. Changed the course of his life, by a rugged wee lad, Who led him to others whose plight were as sad, Then he championed the waif, with vision, fear and vim, Sixty thousand he rescued, from want, valor and sin.
