

An Ever-Increasing Menace

This past Monday afternoon fire broke out at a building at Washington and Forrest Streets used for the storage of waste paper and other scrap materials. It was a
serious fire and extensive damage was done. But for the
vigilance and skill of our local fire companies, it might have ome a disastrous conflagration.

Highest praise is due every member of the five companies

which fought and controlled the blaze. They showed a degree of efficiency at least equal to that displayed by paid fire departments of nearby municipalities.

But the lesson of Monday's blaze is written plainly for every one of us to read. That fire, involving injuries to two firemen and extensive damage to a valuable building, could have been prevented. Repeatedly our Fire Commission had ordered the dangerous condition to be remedied, and repeatedly the operator was fined for failing to comply with those orders. Tuesday night a further fine of \$20 was imposed. More important than the fine, however, is the matter of adequate precautions against repetition of Monday's occurrence.

In buildings used for residential purposes, overcrowding may become a very serious element.






