Montgomery County Still Suffering

Throughout the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania the season is now on when volunteer fire companies, hospitals, churches, civic, fraternal and patriotic organizations hold lotteries for the purpose of obtaining money to finance the purchase of equipment and to defray expenses generally. In 66 of the 67 counties of this Commonwealth these things are taking place. The only county in which lotteries are prohibited by actual order of any district attorney is our own Montgomery County.

Governor George M. Leader and the entire State Police department have declined time and again to lift a little finger to bring about enforcement of a statute banning a lottery. They just won't do it. And of all the hundreds — or is it thousands — of police officers on duty in the various cities, boroughs, townships and villages, not a single department makes the slightest effort to halt any kind of lottery ... except little of Monty!

Frequently lotteries are held on main streets of towns. Automobiles that are grand prizes are exhibited on the main street. Signs advertising the time and place of a lottery and naming the organization deriving benefit from it hang on bullet in boards in a number of police stations, and are posted prominently along many heavily traveled streets and highways patrolled by officers of the law 24 hours a day.

District Attorney DiJoseph stands alone.

And volunteer fire companies suffer.

Churches, lodges, parochial and private schools, hospitals suffer.

There would be less objection if the D. A. were getting somewhere in his crusade. But he isn't. His neighboring D. A., Victor Blanc, of Philadelphia, won't order enforcement in Philadelphia county of the same statute DiJoseph enforces to the letter of the law in Montgomery County. If Blanc were concerned, he would have stepped in July 4th when an anatomobile and five other valuable prizes were given away in a lottery conducted annually in Manayunk ... a lottery never interrupted by city police down through the years.

Nor does the Philadelphia Police department

volunteer firemen were sent to jail for conducting lotteries.

The area also includes Barren Hill and Spring Mill, where both fire companies have been deprived the opportunity to raise money by giving away automobiles and other prizes four or five years under penalty of members going to the county prison at Norristown.

How long will the lid stay on in Montgomery county? There's no chance it will be lifted.

County firemen could form a vigilante committee which would see that a call went out to State Police to stop every lottery known to be taking place. This step, essential if there is to be equity for Montgomery County, eventually will result in favorable action from our State Senators and members of the House of Representatives, all of whom have been stone silent on this issue for years. It will make life miserable for a while in hundreds of communities, but is there any other way to lick our own misery?

With a Fugitive

Raiph Beaver Strassburger, publisher of the Times Herald, is a fugitive from justice. He eludes the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the local police department by hiding away in the luxurious French Riviera. His flight from justice is financed largely by an exensive number of citizens of Montgomery County. One of them is a Norristown banker who holds public office in Plymouth Township, serving in not one, but two casacities. Some taxpayers are of the opinion he should occupy only one appointive office. But in view of his generous support of a known fugitive he disqualifies himelef from holding public office at all.

If T. Allen Glenn were to visit France he undoubtedly would do what Hedda Hopper did recently and enjoy nimself more thoroughly than the columnist says she lid in her write-up of the hours she spent as guest of talph Beaver Strassburger. Here are Hedda's own words:— NOTICE






